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Thank you for your interest in answering the call to minister to our students. The call to pick up our cross is not an easy one and making time, opening your homes, and opening your hearts to these students is not a cross taken up lightly. So thank you.

As you know Cloverdale has a vision statement of areas we want our congregation to focus on growing in our walk with Christ. The Campus Ministry seeks to be in sync with that vision and we have four "values" that we center our ministry around to achieve that.

First we seek to CONNECT. We want our students to connect to one another and connect with the church family here at Cloverdale. We specifically want to give our students opportunities to form relationships that are intergenerational so they have opportunities to learn from mature Christians and have chances to serve as examples to our children and teens.

Secondly we seek to be a ministry where everyone LEARNS. We want students to learn more about God and His special calling on their lives. We also

seek to learn more about our students and their experiences and beliefs. Students represent the future of our congregations all over the world. If we are to connect with them effectively we must learn who they are and where they believe God is leading them.

Third, we seek to GROW together. We want to be a ministry that stretches out of our comfort zone. We want to challenge students and give them opportunities to serve in ways that they haven't before. We want to also get out of our comfort zone and allow students to serve and grow in areas that we ourselves usually serve. It may be uncomfortable listening to a young man give a devotional thought for the first time or a young lady try to teach, but ultimately the family grows and matures through these experiences.

Finally, we seek to be a church that helps launch our students out to a hurting world that needs the hope we share. We want to give our students an understanding of what God is doing in this world and we hope they hear the words of Christ which commands us to "Go" by the power of His Name.
